

CPAS School Briefing for Parents Of 13-Year-Old Functional Programme Senior Students

CPAS School Briefing for parents of 13-year-old Functional Programme (FP) senior students was conducted on 30 January 2021. This briefing occurs annually for parents of students in the first year of the FP senior classes and is conducted by the Transition Planning (TP) team consisting of the Transition Planning Coordinator (TPC), Transition Planning Officer (TPO), Job Coaches (JC), and the class teacher.

The objective of the meeting is to share information about the FP senior classes, set expectations between family and School, and the role parents can play to augment the learning outcomes of their child to ensure success upon graduation.

Due to the demands of the current pandemic situation, the meeting, which used to be conducted face to face at CPAS School, was done virtually this year, via Zoom. Although so, it was full attendance by the parents of 6 FS senior students. It is indeed encouraging to see the support and commitment from the parents towards the success of their child. It is good that several students attended the meeting with their parents, as this shows their increased awareness, ownership and advocacy for their future.

The TP team explained the post-school outcomes available to students from the FS Programme, and that the focus for FP senior students would be to apply the knowledge and skills learned in class into the community. Parents were informed that senior students would be learning travelling skills and would have mandatory Community Mobility lessons weekly. They would also need to improve on their skills in Activities for Daily Living in the areas of self-care, and personal hygiene. They would also be improving on their communication skills in seeking clarification or help, as well as communicating about their emotions. Parents were also encouraged to provide ample opportunities for their teenage child to learn to do things on their own because we must believe that the child/student CAN!

Positive feedback and encouragement was given to the IT team. Teachers expressed their excitement as they look forward to using the skill in their classrooms for the teaching and learning. In the course, teachers learnt the following:

- ★ Capturing footages using a green screen
- * Screen casting and air dropping files
- ★ Using iMovie to enhance movies with video effects (e.g. green screen, picture in picture, voice over, titles, close captions etc.)
- ★ Exporting videos into different file formats

As the feedback was good, the IT team continues to plan for future courses and workshops for all staff, so as to upscale their skills and knowledge in IT.



MLS Experience and Learnings

Senior Teacher Ms Wang Ai Ling attended a course on Management & Leadership in Schools (MLS), a 17-weeks course for middle level leaders in schools. From the course, these leaders will learn skills and knowledge to expand their roles beyond their departments, as well as to take on direct leadership roles in teaching and learning so as to move towards being an innovative school. In summarising the essence of MLS, Ms Ai Ling shared the following model on 3 focus areas - Mind, Hands and Heart, and draw the link to learning.

Mind

The Result of Our Life or Work = Attitude x Effort x Ability (-100 to 100) x (0 to 100) x (0 to 100)

The most important factor in this equation is attitude as it can seen that the value can range from -100 to 100. It will have a minus impact on result once attitude is in negative range. A mind focused on the negative attracts a negative outcome.

Hands

"Give, don't take." is one of the classic phrases emphasized by the NIE lecturer Professor Ng Pak Ti. It is through this spirit that school leaders can build on a culture of care and concern.

Respect all individuals as all are different with their unique strengths and challenges. If the team is able to complement each other, that will be the best scenario. If it doesn't, the team members will have to lift each other up and by doing so, they are lifting themselves up too.

Heart

Keeping students at the heart of what leaders do and knowing the greater purpose to work towards the vision of 'Active in the community, Valued in the society'.

Through this course, all 184 MLSers were united in a way by a common purpose – to bring out the best in their people, both teachers and students. People matter.

Virtual Teachers' Investiture Ceremony for Class of 2020

They also learnt about providing basic care for children with special needs, as well as teaching life skills, behaviour moderation, and social skills to these special students.

On 4 February 2021, a Teachers' Investiture Ceremony was held for these student-teachers from the full-time course. This ceremony is a solemn and celebratory special event that marks a SPED teacher' formal entry to the teaching profession. Due to the constraints of the Covid-19 pandemic, the event was postponed and held virtually via Zoom, which was originally scheduled to be held in July 2020.

More than 900 graduands from all NIE courses attended the Investiture, and family and friends were invited to witness the ceremony too. Mr. Lawrence Wong, Minister for Education, was the Guest of Honour, and Mr. Wong Siew Hoong, Director-General of Education, led in the Teachers' Pledge-Taking to formally mark the teacher graduands initiation into the teaching fraternity of Singapore. In order to capture the precious moments of the special occasion, a celebration kit was given to all graduands and part of the kit was the gift of a virtual photo booth session for the graduands to create memories with family and friends.
