## **Special Arts CCA Joins Artbrellah Project Launch**

On 23<sup>rd</sup> August 2025, Project Art-brellah, a meaningful initiative combining art, accessibility, and social responsibility, was launch at Toa Payoh Interchange. We are proud to share that CPASS East Special Arts CCA was invited to the launch because CCA member, Joanne Ngoh Pei Sing's artwork, Tree of Love, was selected to be printed on umbrellas as part of this project.

Project Art-brellah is a low-cost umbrella-sharing initiative by SBS Transit and Sharelah SG that features umbrellas designed by beneficiaries from MINDS, SPD and Cerebral Palsy Alliance Singapore. These designs are transformed into canvases of art to promote inclusivity and care. Commuters can borrow these umbrellas at rental kiosks or purchased via the ShareLah SG app. Proceeds would be channelled to support Community Chest's social service programmes.

The launch was graced by Guest-of-Honour (GOH) Mr Chee Hong Tat, Minister for National Development and Adviser to Bishan-Toa Payoh Grassroots Organisations. Joanne gave a heartfelt speech of her artwork and shared that the Tree of Love symbolized growth through mutual support, similar to how the sky, grass, and soil help a tree flourish. SBS Transit gifted Joanne with an umbrella featuring her design as well as goodie bags. It was a proud moment for Special Art CCA and a celebration of art with purpose.

Singapore in Motion







### **MOE Teachers' Conference and ExCEL Fest (TCEF) 2025**

#### **★ TCEF Learning Journey at CPAS School East**

CPAS School (East) was honoured to be selected as a host school for the TCEF Learning Journey, welcoming a group of 20 educators from various educational institutions on Wednesday, 7<sup>th</sup> May 2025, from 2.00 p.m. to 4.30 p.m. The objective of the Learning Journey was to provide participants with a deeper understanding of the unique challenges and strengths of students with multiple disabilities.

During the visit, participants had firsthand exposure to the school's tailored educational approaches, supportive learning environments, and the positive impact of specialised teaching methods. They were also introduced to assistive technologies that support student engagement, participation, and academic performance. Experiencing these tools in action enabled participants to better understand their usability and effectiveness, and how practical accessibility solutions can significantly enhance learning outcomes. The Learning Journey was a resounding success. Participants described their experience as fruitful and enriching and expressed deep appreciation for the opportunity to interact with both staff and students.

#### **★** Concurrent Sessions: Sharing of Best Practices

As part of the TCEF Concurrent Sessions on 4<sup>th</sup> June 2025, CPAS School East and West were also selected to share their best practices.

Their presentation, titled "Fostering Holistic Development Through the Use of Holo Tracker at CPASS," showed how both schools use the Holo Tracker to recognise students who show school values in different settings.

The session was presented by Ms Faezah, CPAS School (East) and Ms Noredah, CPAS School (West). It drew strong interest, with high sign-up and attendance, and was well-received by the audience.
